In her new role, Dr. Freeland will be responsible for the strategic leadership of education programs delivered at Trillium Health Partners, including medical education and health professions education. She will be focused on building strong relationships with community stakeholders and setting the vision and strategy for further integration of the Mississauga Academy of Medicine into the local community.

Trillium Health Partners signed its first affiliation with the University of Toronto in 2007. The Mississauga Academy of Medicine (MAM), one of four medical academies of the University of Toronto, opened its doors in 2011. It is a fully accredited satellite of the U of T medical school in collaboration with U of T Mississauga and Trillium Health Partners that connects the Faculty of Medicine with the largest community hospital in Canada. In June 2015, Trillium Health Partners and MAM will graduate the inaugural class of 53 medical students completing their education in Mississauga.
